Information:

On March 1 and March 16, 2018 students in grades 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 will have the opportunity to participate in a skiing/snowboarding lesson and activity day at Canyon Ski Resort in Red Deer, AB. We will be leaving the school and boarding our Wolf Creek school buses to depart to the hill at 8:30 a.m. and arriving back at 3:00 p.m. It is part of the Outdoor Pursuits component of Physical Education. Students will be supervised by our school staff, volunteers, as well as the Canyon Ski Resort ski instructors. Students may participate on 1 or both days! The program is open to skiers/snowboarders of all levels, including those who have no experience. It is highly recommended that students selecting snowboarding have prior ski experience.

#### Risks:

The risks and possible associated injuries involved with skiing include:

-slipping, falling, sliding down the hill.

-falling as students get onto or off the lifts.

-colliding with other skiers/snowboarders, or other obstacles.

-travelling by school bus to and from the ski hill.

\*\*\*Students MUST listen to the instructor as they will tell them where they are allowed to ski/snowboard according to their level.

Clothing:

Students need to come prepared with appropriate clothing for the day which includes: snow pants, winter coat, gloves and a hat. Goggles and a neck warmer are optional comforts.

Registration:

If your child is interested in participating please complete the online registration & payment through Acorn on our school website. We also need all forms completed and returned-the attached registration form along with two attached consent forms (one from the school and one from the ski hill) by Friday, February 16, 2018 to confirm your skiing/snowboarding spot.

Our payment plan allows you to make your payment up to one week prior to the actual ski date, so that you do not have to pay for both dates at once. The March 1st ski date closes on Feb. 22. and the March 16 ski date closes on March 9. Unfortunately, no exceptions will be made.

\*Please note the following\*

- Once the payment date has expired no more registrations will be accepted. Please look at these dates well in advance.
- No Refunds Will Be Issued unless the school or hill cancels the event and the event cannot be rescheduled.
- It is mandatory for snowboarders and skiers to wear a helmet.



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Each PES skier/snowboarder will <u>participate in a mandatory lesson (included with registration fees)</u> and then have time to practise their skills on the slopes. Students will need a bag lunch with an extra snack and drink. Students are encouraged not to be purchasing items from Canyon's food concession. Therefore, it is not necessary to send money on these days.

#### Parent Volunteers:

The success of our ski/ snowboard program relies on the help of parent volunteers! Parent volunteers need to have a Criminal Record Check on file at the school and will be responsible for their own costs of a lift ticket and rentals at the hill. Parents will also need to arrange for their own transportation.

Please contact our main office if you are interested in being a parent volunteer. As a parent volunteer, your responsibilities may include:

- to help students once they arrive at the hill by finding ski boots, and getting their equipment on.
- to help supervise students in the ski lodge, as well as on the hill.
- to assist those students who are learning to ski. This could entail being available on the training hill or "bunny slope" to offer a helping hand.
- we will also be looking for a couple of volunteers with trucks who can help transport ski/snowboard equipment to the hill.

Parents may only transport their own children from the hill if a notification for transportation form is signed prior to the scheduled trip(s). Forms are available at the office and are also are available at the ski hill if needed.

#### Note to Participants (and legal guardians if under 18 yrs of age) Please Read Carefully!

This form must be completed and signed and is required for all participants who wish to participate in this outdoor recreation and skil snowboard education program. In this agreement, the term "skiing" shall include "snowboarding" and "telemark skiing" and "snow tubing" and "we" shall refer to "participant and his/her parent(s)".

THERE ARE ELEMENTS OF RISK THAT COMMON SENSE AND PERSONAL AWARENESS CAN HELP REDUCE. REGARDLESS OF HOW YOU DECIDE TO USE THE SLOPES, ALWAYS SHOW COURTESY TO OTHERS. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE CODE LISTED BELOW AND SHARE WITH OTHERS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR A SAFE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.

- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3 Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.

- 6 Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- 8 Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
- You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. It in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
